FCRC Vision

FCRC and its staff will advocate for and serve all eligible individuals without regard to disability, dependent status, race, creed, color, sex, national origin, age, religion, or financial status (Title VI). FCRC will ensure quality of life to those served by providing exposure to opportunities, freedom of choice, opportunities for participation in community life, and by encouraging and developing self-direction in all served.

Services

Qualified Intellectual Disability Professional services are provided with the involvement and cooperation of other agencies when appropriate.

Direct Service Personnel receive orientation and on-the-job training which includes formal classroom instruction.

How to Apply for FCRC Services

PUNS stands for Prioritization of Urgency of Need for Services. PUNS is a list of the people in Illinois with developmental disabilities who need services. PUNS is for everyone who may need help from the government to pay for developmental disability services now or in the future.

PUNS is the first step toward getting services in Illinois. If you are not on the PUNS list, you are not on the waiting list for services.

To get on PUNS, you need to set up a date to meet with a Pre-Admission Screener, who will ask questions about you and your needs. All screeners work for Independent Service Coordination Agencies or ISC's. The ISC for Fulton County is Prairieland Service Coordination at 217-362-6128. The ISC for Mason County is Central Illinois Service Access at 217-732-4731, Ext. 141.

Community Day Service Program

Fulton County Rehabilitation Center, Inc. provides a comprehensive habilitation program for adult individuals with developmental disabilities, whose disability presents a significant handicap. Services are provided through the Community Day Service Program.

The Community Day Service Program is a program of day habilitation that focuses on the development of and enhancement of daily adaptive living skills and economic self-sufficiency. Annual assessments are completed that identify the individual's strengths and needs, level of, and services required to meet the individual's wants, needs, and desires.

FCRC offers goal oriented active treatment. An Individualized Program Plan or Implementation Strategy Plan is developed for each individual that provides support in achieving the desired outcome in the areas of home, important relationships, career & income, health & well-being, communication, life in the community, recreation, autonomy and future plans.

Educational Services

Fulton County Rehabilitation Center offers educational services that provide participants with an enjoyable and meaningful day while building the knowledge and skills necessary to enrich their lives. Opportunities include:

Academic opportunities:

Individual participants learn about different academic topics such as math, science, history, English, health, reading, current events, and technology.

Community Access Opportunities:

Individual participants are able to participate in various outings including shopping, academic visiting opportunities, recreation, tours, picnics, volunteer opportunities, and other outings of choice.

Health and Wellness Education Opportunities:

Participants learn about the importance of fitness, exercise, nutrition, and safety at home and in the community. Education also focuses on development and maintenance of fine and gross motor skills.

Life Skills Education:

Participants learn skills in cooking, hygiene, first aid, money management, laundry and housekeeping skills, and community access.

Special Interest Opportunities:

Participants can explore music, art, sign language, photography, and other interests.
